The Navy is a responsible environmental steward and preserves cultural resources while training to accomplish its mission.

The Navy collaborates with federal, state and local agencies and tribes to proactively identify and minimize impacts on the environment.

CULTURAL RESOURCES IN THE FALLON RANGE TRAINING COMPLEX

- ▶ As of August 2014, there are 823 known archaeological sites on training ranges
 - 67 sites are eligible for the National Register of Historic Places
 - 258 sites are not eligible
 - 498 sites are currently unevaluated

DRAFT EIS FINDINGS - Cultural Resources

Buildings, structures, districts, archaeological sites, historic landscapes and traditional cultural properties of significance in history, architecture, archaeology, engineering or culture

- ▶ The Navy's effects determinations and NEPA conclusions are pending Section 106 consultations with the State Historic Preservation Office and Native American Tribes
- ▶ Procedures are currently in place for identification, evaluation and protection of cultural resources
